



The Texas Department of Emergency Management is trying to collect information on damages to businesses and homeowners caused by the winter weather event. This is an effort to collect information only and is not a method to seek reimbursement.

Completing this form will potentially help our county qualify for individual assistance.

Homeowners and renters are asked to self-report any damages from the storm using an online survey. FEMA will not be performing assessments so it's vital that people self-report.

“Governor Abbott has announced a statewide effort to collect damage assessment data for this unprecedented event. This information is being collected to help officials across the state gain an understanding of damages for individuals throughout Texas. Our objective is to demonstrate the scale of this disaster at the local level. It's very important that our residents submit damage assessments using this survey,” said Craig Moreau, chief of emergency management.
