The final plans and drainage calculations submitted on 3/8/2023 for *Forge Global Industries, Inc.* have been reviewed. This is for a commercial/industrial development located at 11173 State Highway 36, Wallis, Texas.

The storm runoff from the site generally drains towards the southeast property line into a small depression that outfalls into the roadside ditch of State Highway 36 (SH 159). Approximately 70% of the tract will be developed per plan set and the remaining area is to be left undeveloped. The developed proportion of the tract will drain towards a proposed detention pond via overland flow. The pond will be a wet pond and utilize a weir for the outfall. The weir will outfall into a proposed drainage swale along the southeast parcel boundary and ultimately outfall into the roadside ditch along SH 36. A copy of the approved TxDOT permit has been provided as part of the submittal package. The undeveloped land storm runoff will drain naturally away from the tract matching pre-developed conditions.

We find the submittal of the *Forge Global Industries, Inc.* plan set to be in general accordance with Austin County Subdivision Regulations with respect to drainage. We have no objection to the County issuance of permits relating to site drainage improvements.

This review did not include full verification of the calculations provided. The plans and drainage calculations submitted have been prepared, signed, and sealed by a professional engineer licensed to practice engineering in the State of Texas which conveys the engineer's responsibility and accountability. Omissions in this review do not relieve those associated with the project from complying with the Austin County Rules and Regulations or any other regulatory requirements from any other entity having jurisdiction. **If the undeveloped portion of this tract is developed in the future, the owner should submit plans to Austin County for review.**

National Emergency Number Association (NENA) road naming and numbering standards:

1. Every distinct road with two or more dwellings should be given a separate, unique name. This includes all private roads and driveways.
2. Each road should have one -- and only one -- correct name. A named road should be essentially continuous, without gaps.
3. Road names and/or numbers should only change when there is a substantial intersection, or at municipal boundaries.
4. When needing to name a road with two or more numbers in different sections, the name of the road that is used for the longest distance or is most heavily traveled should be kept.
5. A long driveway with only one house at its end might be named if the potential exists to erect additional structures along that driveway.
6. There should be no duplicate road names and/or numbers, such as Pine Road and Pine Lane in the same zip code and fire district.
7. There should be no similar-sounding names, such as Beach Avenue and Beech Avenue, Main Street and Maine Street, or Apple Hill Road and Apple Road in the same zip code and fire district.
8. Road names should be assigned based on traffic patterns. When a road forks into two roads, the fork with the higher traffic volume should continue the same name.
9. If a road has more than one branch at the end, use separate names and/or numbers for the multiple branches.
10. Roads should not be identified by a route number.
11. Avoid special characters, such as hyphens, apostrophes, periods, or decimals, in road names.

12. When having to rename roads with similar-sounding and/or numbers, consider the following:
- The road with a name of historical significance should have its name retained.
 - The road with the most properties on it, and thus a name change would affect a greater number of residents, should retain its name.
 - The road that has retained its name for the longest time or has been consistently signed for the longest time should retain its name. The same would be true for a road with a more descriptive name.
13. When naming roads that connect two other roads but have a middle section that is closed permanently or is impassable at certain times of year, consider:
- Retaining the current name for one end of the road and assign a different name to the other end of the road.
 - Retaining the same name at each end of the road and assign two-digit numbers to properties along one end of the road and three-digit numbers to properties along the other end. If this option is chosen and the potential exists to further develop the road in the future, lay out the numbers to insure that there is no possibility of having any three-digit numbered at the two-digit end and vice versa.
 - Assigning a direction to each end of the road, such as North Mountain Road and South Mountain Road.
14. When renaming roads in a jurisdiction with a significant summer population, send notices to seasonal residents, giving them an opportunity to mail in their road name suggestions within 30 days.
15. Use themes, such as wildlife, trees, or historic persons, to name unnamed roads. Use a specific theme to name private roads and driveways leading off a specific main road or around a specific body of water.
16. Roads within multi-structure complexes (e.g., business campus, multi-unit apartment complex) should be named and each structure individually addressed.

17. Keep road names short. They are easier to remember.

18. When naming new roads, consider the following suggestions:

- Avenue = a thoroughfare running principally in a north-south direction (or could be east-west depending on how "street" is defined).
- Circle = short road that returns to itself; circular or semi-circular roads.
- Court = Permanently closed road such as a cul-de-sac; dead-end road, usually under 1,000 feet in length, or horseshoe-shaped road.
- Lane = Private road or driveway.
- Loop = Short drive that begins and ends on the same road
- Road = most common designation for a secondary thoroughfare; generally indicates a heavily traveled route.
- Street = Usually found in cities or more congested areas; run principally in an east-west direction (or could be north-south depending on how "avenue" is defined).

19. Every official road name should have a corresponding standard suffix that complies with the National Emergency Nine One One Association's (NENA) standards.

Dear Judge Lapham:

The Preliminary Plat for Southfork Ranch Section 1 Subdivision has been submitted for consideration by Commissioners Court. This is a proposed subdivision of 11.061 acres consisting of 33 residential lots and 4 reserves. The lots appear to be at least 1.0 acre net in size. The tract of land is located in the San Felipe de Austin Town Tract, Abstract 5, Austin County, Texas. The property is on the southeast side of F.M. 3013 between Harrison Road and Rice Field Road in Precinct 4.

Reserve A is proposed for the construction of a detention basin and Reserve B is proposed for channel improvements. The preliminary drainage plan includes this basin outfalling to the adjacent existing drainage channel. The Final Plat shall contain a drainage easement along this drainage channel. However, the easement would not be dedicated to Austin County, and therefore Austin County would not have the responsibility or obligation to maintain this easement.

It is our understanding that the developer has discussed with the County multiple variance requests for the following:

- 10-foot utility easement on each side of a side lot line to be required on every other side lot line instead of every side lot line as per the County's Subdivision Regulations.
- Right of way width of 60' instead of 70'.
- Block length more than 1,200 linear feet for Southfork Ranch Drive
- Residential lots that do not meet the required width to depth ratio of 3:1 for Lots 14, 15 and 28 in Block 1.

The County has received a formal variance request regarding the above for County consideration, we offer no objection to the granting of the variances. Without the variances being granted, the Preliminary Plat will need to be revised and re-submitted for review.

Southfork Ranch - Variance Request

Dear Judge Tim Lapham,

DPK Engineering LLC acting as agent for the Southfork Ranch Development would like to request the following variance for the following;

The developer is requesting that a variance is granted for allowance of the right of way reduction to be allowed for 60 feet wide versus 70 feet wide.

The developer is requesting that a variance is granted for allowance every other lot line to share a utility easement, this is preferred by Centerpoint Energy and allows all lots to be served.

The developer is requesting that a variance is granted for allowance of the extension of the required block length of 1,200 linear feet. Along Southfork Ranch Drive it is 1,589 linear feet to the first cross street West Fork Drive. From that intersection it is 1,500 linear feet to the culdesac at the end of Southfork Ranch Drive.

The developer is requesting that a variance is granted for allowance of an exception to the width to depth ratio of 1:3. Some of the larger lot tracts are more pie shaped allowing for wider rear property lines than front. These lots are lots 14, 15 and 28 of Block One.

We look forward to working with the County on this project. Thank you for your assistance with these requests.

Approval is hereby granted to INDUSTRY TELEPHONE COMPANY for installation of buried cable, conduit and/or pole line, along across the right of way of County Road, Industry Road, Austin County, Texas.

Authorization is hereby granted for such installation, subject however to the below stated terms and conditions, to-wit:

1. The location and details of the crossing within Austin County must be shown
2. on the road crossing plans and profile drawings and the creek crossing plans and profile drawings provided by the Company requesting the permit.
3. The installation shall be accomplished without damage to the County Road, and any damage that does in fact occur, shall be promptly repaired by and the expense of the Company requesting the permit.
4. Requesting Company will contact the County Commissioner of the respective precinct at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to beginning the construction of the crossings in order that the County may have a representative present. A copy of the Court Order and/or Permit shall be delivered by Company to all construction contractors and for sub-contractors.
5. Adequate provisions must be made by and at the expense of the Requesting Company to cause a minimum of inconvenience to traffic and to adjacent property owners.
6. Emplacement operations are not permitted during wet weather.
7. All cut brush and debris are to be removed from right-of-way within seven (7) days.
7. Open trenches will be protected during off-duty hours by flasher lights.
8. Temporary construction signs are to be placed on the right-of-way at both ends of project.
9. All driveway entrances to be restored to original condition and resurfaced with suitable materials.
10. After construction, the Requesting Company will maintain the line so that there will be no interference with the public use of the roads and function of the creeks.
11. Austin County makes no charge whatever of the granting of this approval, and the agreement of the Requesting Company constitutes the consideration of this approval on the part of the County.
12. The action of the Requesting Company in proceeding with the installation of said pipeline shall constitute the agreement of said company to the terms and conditions of this document.
13. Such additional requirements as the individual situation and circumstance warrants.
 - A. As pertaining to pipelines:

- (1) The pipeline crossing shall be constructed by horizontal bore at a depth so as not to interfere with traffic on the County roads and function of the creeks.
- (2) Pipelines in right of ways shall be buried at a minimum of 36 inches deep below the bottom of road ditch.
- (3) All construction shall be in compliance with ASME B31.4 – 1989 Edition, Liquid Transportation Systems for Hydrocarbons, Liquid Petroleum Gas, Anhydrous Ammonia and Alcohols, as modified By ASME B31.4 a – 1991 Edition.

B. As pertaining to buried cable, the cable shall be buried at a minimum of 36 inches deep below the bottom of road ditch.

14. Any permit issued shall contain the provision that if, at any time in the future, it becomes necessary, in the sole opinion of the Commissioners' Court of Austin County, to lower, encase, relocate, modify or alter the buried utility, in any manner by reason of the widening of the road, or for any other good and sufficient reason, written notice of that opinion will be given to the permittee, and said lowering, encasement, relocation, modification or alteration shall promptly be accomplished by or at the sole expense of the permittee.

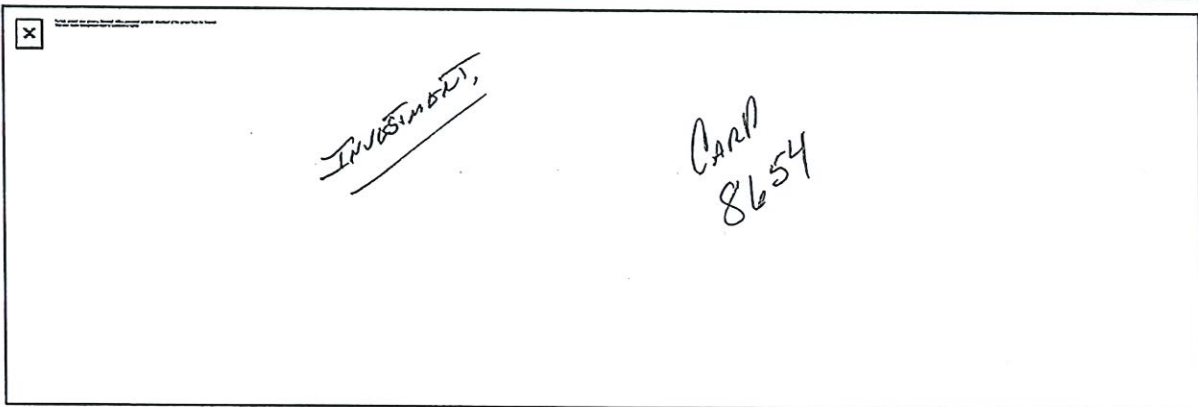
